This year our Library will be open during the second half of lunch on **Mondays**, **Tuesdays and Wednesdays**. Children are always welcome to come in and read a book, borrow, draw or play lego and board games. On **Thursdays** the library will


be open for those students who are interested in Robotics.

Children <u>must</u> use a library bag when they borrow books as this helps protect the books. Please remember that books are on loan for a maximum of two weeks so when books are due back please ensure they are returned promptly. Your assistance with this is greatly appreciated!

<u>Scholastic Book Club:</u> Our school subscribes to the Scholastic Book Club. Twice a term flyers are sent

home for you to have a look at, and perhaps place an order. You'll find award-winning books and bestsellers, as well as old and new favourites. I recommend them because the books span a wide range of children's reading levels and interests and because they are inexpensive (some books cost as little as \$2). Coupons are also given to the school for each dollar spent and these are used to purchase resources for the school.The best gift any parent can give a child is the love of books and the joy and benefits of independent reading for fun. Children who read at home, or are read to, have a head start on reading success in school.

Owning your own books is something special! I hope that you will encourage your child to order books this year. Each order helps earn free books and teaching materials for our classroom, however there is never any obligation to order. I know of no better way to encourage reading than to allow children to choose the books they want to read.



Book Club

The **Gift Function** enables you to tag **Book Club** orders on **LOOP** that are intended as a surprise gift. This feature can be used throughout the year, providing your **Book Club Organiser** has enabled the gift function for your school. **LOOP** orders tagged as a gift will be delivered to school and marked accordingly, for the **Book Club Organiser** to set aside at the school office for you to collect.

Please ensure you put the correct amount of money in a **well-sealed envelope** and place it in the **Book Club Box at the office**. It usually takes about 2 weeks for the orders to be completed. All orders are given to the child to take home. If you would like me to hold the order for you because it is a present please indicate this to me on the order form.



Parents may prefer to order online via loop orders and it is easy to order. The **Book Club LOOP** platform for parents allows you to pay by credit card. Your child's order is submitted directly to school safe and sound and the books will be delivered to class. You can place your child's order at **scholastic.com.au/LOOP** or using the **LOOP** app, which can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play.
